Introduction

At Micheldever & Stratton Preschool we recognise alcohol and drug abuse as social concerns, and supports the need to give parents and children assistance with alcohol and drug related difficulties, which affect their health and work performance. This policy sets out the Preschool's formal arrangements for managing alcohol and drug related issues and applies equally to all parents and/or guardians regardless of age, gender, financial, religious, ethnicity or sexual background.

Procedures

The Preschool endeavours to ensure that parents/guardians use of either alcohol or non-medically prescribed drugs does not impair the safety of their children.

However, the Preschool recognises alcohol and drug abuse as social as well as health and safety at work concerns and supports the need to give parents/guardians assistance with alcohol and drug-related difficulties, which affect theirs and their families lives.

The preschool will therefore take whatever steps are reasonable to ensure that:

- Sufficient information and advice is available to parents/guardians to enable them to be aware of the symptoms and effects of the misuse of drugs and alcohol.
- Parents/guardians who know or suspect that they have an alcohol or drug-related problem are encouraged to seek help voluntarily.
- Confidential advice and help is provided for any parent/guardian with alcohol or drug-related problems.

Should a parent be found or suspected of being under the influence at either drop off or pick up, the staff member who suspects this will inform either the DSL or the manager. They will then take the relevant action in line with our Safeguarding Policy. The child will not be allowed to leave with the said parent/guardian and the emergency contact will be called to collect the child. Should the emergency contact be unavailable, the preschool staff have the right to inform the police and the social services team and make them aware of their suspicions.

Should there be several incidents of alcohol/drug misuse undertaken or suspected by the parent/guardian. The DSL will record all the evidence and will refer to the relevant safeguarding authority. Parents will be called to a meeting to discuss the issues and offered support and help, however, the safeguarding of the child will be at the forefront of any such circumstances.

i) The Keeping Children Safe in Education 2020 and Working Together to Safeguard Children 2018 should be adhered to alongside our Safeguarding Policy 2021 to ensure the welfare and safeguarding of every child.

ii) The Road Traffic Act 1988 makes it a criminal offence to drive or be in charge of a motor vehicle on a road or other public place when unfit through drink or drugs.

iii) The Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 makes the production, supply and possession of controlled drugs unlawful in all but certain specified circumstances.
